



Important Rules!

We want all our students to have fun whilst they are improving their English. We only have a few rules but they are very important. If you break them there will be serious consequences which could mean you are prevented from joining in the full summer school programme or even sent home. Under Kingsway's Terms and Conditions, students and their parents are deemed to have agreed to the following rules:

Follow these rules and you'll stay safe and enjoy your stay more:

- 1) You will be given unsupervised, free time on a regular basis to spend in Worcester and when you are out on trips. It is very important that you behave in a responsible manner and return home or to the meeting point at the time arranged. This privilege will be withdrawn if you do not behave responsibly.
- 2) You may not go into a pub unless accompanied by adult members of your host family.
- 3) You must be in school ready to start lessons at 09h00 Monday – Friday. If you are late you will receive a "late mark" and if you have more than 2 of these in one week you may be prevented from joining an evening activity.
- 4) Evening curfew: On 2 evenings per week there is an activity organised by Kingsway. At the end of the evening your host family will collect you. On other evenings you may go out with your friends but you MUST be home by 21h30. If you are not home by 21h30 your host family is obliged to inform the school and we may involve your parents.
- 5) Buying/drinking alcohol and buying/smoking cigarettes is forbidden at all times during summer school.
- 6) Damage to RGS property: the only places you can play ball games at RGS are the football pitch and the tennis courts. Everywhere else it is forbidden to kick or throw a ball. If you disobey this rule and cause damage to school property, the bill will be sent to your parents.
- 7) Everyone you meet during your stay must be treated with respect: other students, Kingsway staff, members of the host family and the general public.

If any of these rules are broken, Kingsway reserves the right to take action. Depending on the situation you may be prevented from joining a trip or activity or, in the worst case, you may be sent back to your home country at your parents' expense. There will be no compensation if parts of the programme are missed due to breaking school rules.
